3. Manufacturer's Responsibility for the Accuracy of the Declaration of Conformity
Bramster Mietła Sp. K. does not manufacture the packaging materials used for packaging its products. These materials are purchased from specialised suppliers.
Accordingly, this Declaration has been prepared on the basis of documentation received from the manufacturers or suppliers of these materials, in particular the relevant declarations of conformity, statements, technical specifications and other documents confirming the compliance of the materials with the applicable requirements.
4. Subject and Description of the Packaging
The subject of this Declaration is combined transport packaging (tertiary packaging) used exclusively to protect goods against damage and to ensure stability and safety during transport and warehouse logistics.
Due to the type and dimensions of the product range, the goods are packed on non-standard wooden pallets containing products that are visually similar but have different dimensions.
Annex No. 1 contains a list of the packaging materials used.
5. Relevant EU Legislation with Which Compliance Is Confirmed by This Declaration
 - 5.1. Article 5 PPWR – Requirements for Substances in Packaging
The subject of this Declaration, based on information and documentation received from their manufacturers or suppliers, complies with the relevant provisions of Union harmonisation legislation and, furthermore:
 - the sum of the concentration levels of lead (Pb), cadmium (Cd), mercury (Hg) and hexavalent chromium (Cr VI) present in the packaging or packaging components does not exceed 100 ppm (100 mg/kg) by weight;
 - these substances have not been intentionally introduced during the manufacturing process;
 - all packaging and packaging materials comply with the requirements of Regulation (EC) No 1907/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 18 December 2006 concerning the Registration, Evaluation, Authorisation and Restriction of Chemicals (REACH), establishing a European Chemicals Agency, amending Directive 1999/45/EC and repealing Council Regulation (EEC) No 793/93 and Commission Regulation (EC) No 1488/94 as well as Council Directive 76/769/EEC and Commission Directives 91/155/EEC, 93/67/EEC, 93/105/EC and 2000/21/EC (REACH).
 - 5.2. Article 6 PPWR – Recyclable Packaging
All materials used for the combined transport packaging (tertiary packaging) are recyclable, based on information and documentation received from their manufacturers or suppliers.
 - 5.3. Article 7 PPWR – Minimum Recycled Content in Plastic Packaging
The requirements concerning minimum recycled content apply from 2030 within the scope specified in Article 7. At present, this Declaration is based on information provided by the suppliers.
 - 5.4. Article 8 PPWR – Bio-Based Feedstock in Plastic Packaging
Based on information received from the manufacturers or suppliers, none of the materials used contains bio-based feedstock. Therefore, Article 8 PPWR does not apply.
 - 5.5. Article 9 PPWR – Compostable Packaging
Based on information received from the manufacturers or suppliers, none of the materials used is compostable. Therefore, Article 9 PPWR does not apply.
 - 5.6. Article 10 PPWR – Packaging Minimisation
The subject of this Declaration is combined transport packaging (tertiary packaging). Each pallet contains a different range of goods and/or products that are visually similar but have different dimensions. The packaging materials used are limited to the quantity necessary to ensure the protective function, stability and safety of the goods during transport, taking into account the specific dimensions and weight of the products.
The materials have been selected with due consideration for their recyclability, based on information and documentation received from their manufacturers or suppliers.
 - 5.7. Article 11 PPWR – Reusable Packaging
 - 5.7.1. Article 11(1)(a) PPWR – Intended Purpose and Design for Reuse
 - The combined transport packaging (tertiary packaging) is not reusable packaging and is used exclusively to protect goods against damage and to ensure stability and safety during transport and warehouse logistics.
 - The materials have been selected with due consideration for their recyclability, based on information and documentation received from their manufacturers or suppliers.
 - 5.7.2. Article 11(1)(b) PPWR – Suitability for the Maximum Number of Reuses
As stated above under Article 11(1)(a) PPWR.
 - 5.7.3. Article 11(1)(c) PPWR – Protection of Consumer Health, Safety and Hygiene



The packaging materials used do not pose any risk to users' health, safety or hygiene.

- 5.7.4. Article 11(1)(d) PPWR – Unloading Without Damage to the Packaging or Adverse Effects on Its Reusability
As stated above under Article 11(1)(a) PPWR.

- 5.7.5. Article 11(1)(e) PPWR – Unloading and Rehandling Without Damage to the Packaged Product and in Compliance with Health and Safety Requirements

The combined transport packaging (tertiary packaging) used does not pose any safety risks associated with loading, unloading or rehandling, provided that generally applicable occupational health and safety regulations are observed, while at the same time maintaining the quality and safety of the packaged goods.

- 5.7.6. Article 11(1)(f) PPWR – Possibility of Reconditioning (Repair) Without Affecting the Intended Functions
As stated above under Article 11(1)(a) PPWR.

- 5.7.7. Article 11(1)(g) PPWR – Possibility of Labelling

The method and scope of labelling will be adapted to the requirements of Article 12 PPWR and the relevant implementing acts, taking into account the type and category of packaging.

- 5.7.8. Article 11(1)(h) PPWR – Unloading and Rehandling Without Endangering the Health and Safety of Persons

The combined transport packaging (tertiary packaging) used does not pose any safety risks associated with loading, unloading or rehandling, provided that generally applicable occupational health and safety regulations are observed.

- 5.7.9. Article 11(1)(i) PPWR – Compliance with Packaging Recyclability Requirements Pursuant to Article 6 PPWR
According to the information received from manufacturers and suppliers, all components used in the combined transport packaging (tertiary packaging) meet the requirements concerning the recyclability of packaging and packaging materials in accordance with Article 6(1) and (2) PPWR.

The materials used can be easily and effectively separated, sorted and collected within the relevant waste streams. Recycled materials can subsequently be reused as secondary raw materials in the manufacture of new products.

5.8. Packaging Labelling

The method and scope of labelling will be adapted to the requirements of Article 12 PPWR and the relevant implementing acts, taking into account the type and category of packaging.

- EN 13429:2004 (PN-EN 13429:2007): Packaging – Reuse.
- EN 13430:2004 (PN-EN 13430:2007): Packaging – Requirements for packaging recoverable by material recycling.
- EN 13431:2004 (PN-EN 13431:2007): Packaging – Requirements for packaging recoverable in the form of energy recovery, including specification of minimum inferior calorific value.
- EN 13432:2000 (PN-EN 13432:2002): Packaging – Requirements for packaging recoverable through composting and biodegradation – Test scheme and evaluation criteria for the final acceptance of packaging.
